

Summary Laney College Transfer Trends

On average approximately 3% of all Laney Students transfer to UC and or CSU campuses

Transfer trends by ethnicity indicate that:

- ❖ Asian students have slightly decreased in their percentage of transfer
- ❖ African Americans and White students are increasing their transfer rates.
- ❖ Our non resident students are not transferring at as high a rate as they have in the past. (This may be due to increased costs for international students to attend UC and CSU.)

When compared to Laney College enrollments by ethnicity, the trends indicate that¹:

- ❖ Asian students transfer at a significantly higher percent than their representation in the Laney population
- ❖ African American students transfer at a significantly lower rate than their representation at Laney College
- ❖ Hispanic/Latino students transfer at a lower rate than their representation at Laney College

Laney Transfer Rate Ranking (UC/CSU) by College Size Cohort Group (17 campuses) 2007/2008

- ❖ When ranked by size, Laney College ranks 5 in number of transfers to UC.
- ❖ When ranked by size, Laney College ranks 16 in number of transfers to CSU

Laney College Top Four Transfer Schools (UC/CSU) 2003 to 2008

- **UC:**

 - UC Davis transfers have consistently declined over the past 3 years
 - UCLA transfers have been fairly consistent

 - Transfers to CSU East Bay have been inconsistent
 - Transfers to San Francisco State University have declined over the past 4 years

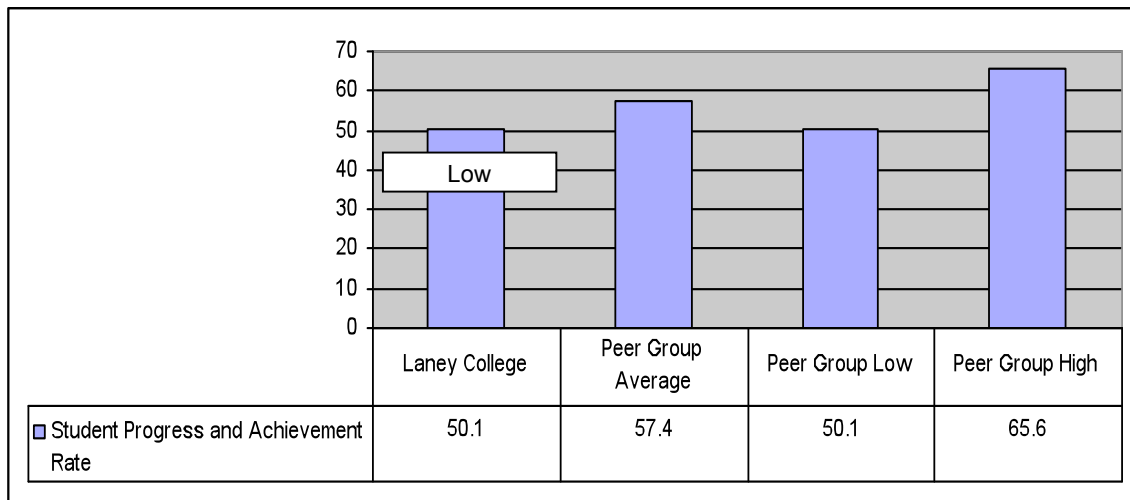
California State Assembly Bill AB1417 (Pacheco) [Chapter 581, Statutes of 2004] required the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges to recommend to the Legislature and Governor a workable structure (framework) for annual evaluation of community college performance in meeting statewide educational outcome priorities.

ARCC Accountability Indicator – Student Progress and Achievement Rate: Percentage of first-time students who showed intent to complete and who achieved any of the following outcomes within six years which includes transferred to a four-year college, or earned an AA/AS degree, or earned a Certificate. Or achieved “Transfer Direct” status, or achieved “Transfer Prepared” status compared to a State assigned peer group.
